Nursery Application Form 2025-2026

Thank you for your interest in a place at Five Ways Primary School's Nursery. Please return this form as soon as possible or by the closing date which is the **14th March 2025**. After the closing date, all applications will be considered and offers of places will be made on **21**st **March 2025**.

If the school has enough places for all of the children applying, then they will all be offered a place. However, if there are more applicants then places available the following process will be followed (as per the Nursery's admissions policy which is on our website).

For Nursery admissions from September 2025, all places are allocated by Five Ways Primary School in accordance with the school's Nursery Admissions policy. We ask applicants to read the policy before completing an application.

A 3-term Nursery place for September 2025 will be offered to children born between: 1st September 2021 – 31st August 2022.

(Children applying will need to have had their third birthday before 1st September 2025)

A 5 term-term Nursery place for January 2026 will be offered to children born between:

1st September 2022 – 31st December 2022 (providing Nursery spaces are available)

(Children applying will need to have had their third birthday before 1st January 2026)

Use of Provision Hours

At Five Ways, we have considered carefully the way in which the funding can impact each child's care and learning within Nursery. With this as our priority, all children attending our full-time teacher-led Nursery need to take up **all morning places - 8:45am - 11:45am** (three hours of provision a day) **for five mornings**. Lunch and afternoon sessions can be paid for either by the '30 hours' NEF funding or paid for directly by parents to school. The table below shows available sessions within Nursery and the cost of sessions and wraparound care available.

Morning Nursery	3 hours each day 8:45am - 11:45am	Non-negotiable hours - all Nursery pupils to access morning sessions Funded by '15 hours'
Lunchtime	11:45am - 12:45pm	Cost is £5.08 (or use 1 hour of additional '30 hours' funding) In addition, parents will need to provide a packed lunch or pay for a school meal (£2 per school meal)

Afternoon Nursery including lunchtime	11:45pm – 3.15pm	Can be funded by '30 hour' code or cost is £17.78 per day (plus £2 per school meal)
Wrap Around afternoon for '30 hours' children	12:45pm – 3:15pm	An afternoon additional to '30 hours' funding costing £14
After-School club	3:15pm – 5:30pm	Cost is £10

Please note: Costs may vary slightly due to annual charging review.

Whichever sessions children access, we require all children to stay for the full Nursery session provided. This is due to legal staffing ratios required for Nursery children and also because we prioritise the welfare, care and learning of all children. It is important to us that all children receive the highest possible learning opportunities and the very best level of nurture at all times.

Not every child will be eligible for the 30 hours but everyone will still receive the 15 hours free childcare that is currently available. These 15 hours can only be used for the morning sessions.

30 Hours Eligibility

The eligibility rules for 30 hours free childcare are as follow:

- Your child will be aged 3 the term before funding is due to start
- Both parents, or the sole parent in a lone parent family, must be working or getting parental leave, sick leave or annual leave
- Each parent earns, on average, a weekly minimum equivalent to 16 hours at National Minimum Wage or National Living Wage
- Each parent must have an annual income of less than £100,000
- You live in England

- 1) Section 22 Children Act 1989 states the general duty of the Local Authority in relation to children in public care. Children who are in the care of the Local Authority or who are provided with accommodation, for a continuous period of more than 24 hours, pursuant to any functions of a social services authority, are children in public care. Section 22 (3) imposes the duty on a Local Authority looking after a child to safeguard and promote their welfare and to make such use of services available for children cared for by their parents as appears to the authority to be reasonable in their case.
- 2) Families will be entitled to Early Years Pupil Premium if a family is in receipt of one of the following benefits:

Income Support, Income based Jobseekers Allowance, Income related Employment and Support Allowance, Child Tax Credit (providing you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190), Working Tax Credit Run-on, paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit, Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999, The guaranteed element of State pension Credit Or if the child:

Has been looked after by the local authority in care for at least one day / Has been adopted from care / Has left care through special guardianship / Is subject to a child arrangement order.

Five Ways Primary School offers the following sessions:

The 15 hours a week morning offer (15 hours funded) 8:45 am to 11:45 am Monday – Friday during term time
