Summer

- Name, recognise and remember up to 10 ice-cream flavours in French. Attempt to spell some of these flavours. Use the structure 'je voudrais...' plus an ice-cream flavour. Say whether we would like a cone or pot and possibly how many scoops. Learn how to say 'please' and 'thank you' in French.
- Order a selection of typical foods, drinks and snacks from a French menu and order a French breakfast. Perform a simple role play ordering food, drink and/or snacks in a French café using useful language such as' hello', 'can I have...', 'the bill please', 'thank you' and 'goodbye'
- Recognise, recall and spell up to ten instruments in French with the correct definite article/determiner. • Start to understand articles/determiners

- Recognise and recall basic items of clothing

Describe what we have and do not have in our pencil case/rucksack.
