Many parents will be aware that Mr McFarlane, who was our music specialist teacher at Five Ways, sadly passed away in May 2024. As well as Mr McFarlane being an outstanding teacher and a highly regarded member of staff at Five Ways, he was also a Mini enthusiast. When Mr McFarlane passed away due to cancer, his family and friends resolved to do something both to celebrate the man he had been and to help future families caught in the same difficult circumstances.

In May 2025, a group of Mr McFarlane's closest friends and family will carry parts of an original Mini car up a 14.9 mile track and construct the car's shell at the top of the Black Mountain (Twyn Llech). E-Scooters and the Law

For any parents whose children have or are getting an e-scooter, do you know the law related to them? E-scooters cannot be used on a UK public road, cycle lane or pavement. The only place an e-scooter can be used is on private land with the land owner's permission. This is because e-scooters are classified as Powered Transporters, so they are treated as motor vehicles and subject to the same legal requirements such as MOT, Licensing, Tax and Insurance. As e-scooters do not have number plates, signalling ability and do not always have visible rear lights, they cannot be used legally on the roads.
